

## Young pair win Pro-Pro Championship at 17-under


he Professional Golfers' Association of British Columbia crowned tion of British Columbia crowned the first winners of their newest event, the PING GOLF PGA of BC Pro-Pro Championship, with the young pair of Chilliwack Golf & Country Club's Jared Rempel and Sun Rivers Brad Clapp. The 36-hole event, held at Nicklaus North Golf Course, offers golf professionals the opportunity to pair up with any other member of the PGA of BC with the first round a hest-hall forof BC, with the first round a best-ball format, and the second round a scramble.

Clapp and Rempel bested their opening best ball score of 63 with a solid scramble score of 62 to go wire-to-wire to capture the championship at 17-under par, with the team earning \$2,000. The win followed an already impressive month of golf for Clapp, who narrowly lost in a playoff to top ranked Canadian Professional Adam Hadwin the week prior at the Paine Edmonds Vancouver Open.


Tied for second at 13-under par was the team of Daryl Stubbs and David Bolton (66-63), and Davy Studds and David Bolton (66-63), and Dave Zibrik and Lindsay Bernakevitch (65-64). Each team walks away with \$1,163 for their fine play. Alone in fourth place at 12-under par with team earnings of \$825 was Doug Morgan and Phil Jonas (68-62).



# SWANSON SUCCESSFULLY DEFENDS HIS

### Club Professional Championship title

he Professional Golfers' Association of BC closed out its tournament season at the exclusive Richmond Country Club for the Callaway Golf PGA of BC Club Professional Championship. Defending champion Dan Swanson from the Guildford Golf Course followed his opening round of 3-under par 69 with a 2-under par 70 to narrowly defeat Two Eagles Golf Course & Academy's Dean Claggett by two strokes and win the Championship.

During the first round, Swanson was 1-over par through 14 holes and was not pleased with his performance, but he quickly wrote a different story shooting 4-under on the last four holes (highlighted with holing out from behind a tree on the par 4 15th hole for eagle) to take the overnight lead by one stroke over Claggett.


Half-way through the final round, Swanson rolled in a 40-foot putt on the par 3 9th hole to hold a two stroke lead over Claggett at 6-under par heading to the final nine. A few holes later at the 13th, a two shot swing resulted as Swanson bogeyed and Claggett birdied tying them both for the lead heading to the final five holes at 4-under par.

Both leaders would bogey the difficult par-3 14th hole, but a Claggett bogey on the 15th hole would have him trailing by one. Claggett had to settle for par after missing a short birdie putt on the 17th hole, leaving Swanson a one stroke lead going to the 18th and final hole.

On the back of the green in three on the par-5 18th, Claggett's birdie attempt from the fringe slid by giving Swanson a chance to two-putt to win, but he coolly drained the 15-footer for birdie to capture the Championship by two. Swanson earned \$2,400 for this victory, with Claggett earning \$1,650 for solo-runner up. Tsawwassen Springs' Murray Poje finished the tournament at 2-under par and third place earning \$1,100. Olympic View's Kevin Maxwell, who played in the final group with Swanson and Claggett, finished in red figures at 1-under par earning \$925. David Bolton from Savage Creek Golf Centre rounded out the top five earning \$800.

The PGA of British Columbia would like to thank Andy Dexter and Grant Oben with title sponsor Callaway Golf who was on-hand throughout the event, as well as the hospitality from Richmond Country Club for the wonderfully manicured golf course and delicious meals. The event had thirty of British Columbia's top Club Professionals compete for the \$12,000 purse.

### JIM GIBSON RECEIVES PGA of BC

#### Lifetime Achievement Award



packed ballroom of PGA of British Columbia members, friends, colleagues, and family were on hand at Richmond Country Club on Monday, October 3rd to award Jim Gibson with the prestigious Lifetime Achievement Award. This highest level of honour is not awarded every year and has only been awarded five previous times in the history of the PGA of BC.

The award honors individuals who have made outstanding contributions to the Association over extended periods of time and one quick scan of Gibson's golfing resume made him an obvious choice for the PGA of BC.

To highlight a few, Gibson was President of the BCGA for three years and was bestowed an honorary lifetime Governor. Gibson was the proud recipient of the PGA of BC's Patron of the Year award and he earned the position of Honorary Director with the PGA of BC. Gibson was also the former Director of Golf, Club Captain, and Senior's Club Champion at the esteemed Capilano Golf and Country Club. In 2002, Gibson received the Queen's medal, one of only 50 given out in Canada. Gibson has committed himself to the Rules of golf as Governor for the Royal Canadian Golf Association for eight years and Rules Chairman for Amateur Status. He currently has been offering rulings for the PGA of BC's most prestigious events for over a decade.

Gibson's golf accomplishments are equally impressive as he has set three different golf club's course records, including a 62 which still stands at Gleneagles Golf Club. He was a multiple Club Champion winner at Seymour Golf & Country Club and finished 13th at the Canadian Open, one stroke ahead of his good friend, and fellow Lifetime Achievement honouree, Stan Leonard.

Gibson's wife (Wilma), children (Kathy and Ross), and three grandchildren were present to hear entertaining speeches and anecdotes from Cec Ferguson (Executive Professional at Vernon G&CC and 2011 Inductee into the Golf Hall of Fame of BC), Steve Carroll (former Executive Director of the PGA of BC), and Doug Sinclair (PGA of Canada Life Member). Derek Thornley, President of the PGA of BC and Richmond Country Club's Head Professional, presented the award to Gibson amidst numerous standing ovations.

# Alvie Thompson Legendary PGA of BC Professional

We can learn much from those that have gone before us! This piece is written with the intent to highlight the accomplishments and contributions of many great golf professionals who are now retired or in the twilight years of great careers. Much can be learned from them and this is the essence of mentorship. ~ Barrie McWha

Ivie Thompson was born in Unity, Saskatchewan approximately 75 years ago. His golf career took roots at Marine Drive Golf Club in the early fifties and in 1954 he finished second in the BC Junior. The following year he was low amateur in the Alberta Open and low qualifier in the PNGA Championship. He won both the Broadmoor Pro-Am and the Seymour Pro-Am in 1955 as an amateur.

Alvie became a member of the PGA of Canada in 1957 as an assistant at Marine Drive Golf Club, working for the legendary Stan Leonard. In 1959, Alvie won the BC Assistants' Championship prior to moving to Toronto to become the Teaching Professional at the Northwood CC in 1960. That year he was runner-up to George Knudson in the Ontario Assistants' Championship and he also won the Wishing Well Invitational in London, Ontario in a playoff over Moe Norman.

In 1962, Alvie was invited to play in the Crosby Pro-Am at Pebble Beach and he won his first of three Manitoba Opens. Alvie also won the Canadian PGA Championship shooting a course record 64 in a playoff with George Knudson and Stan Leonard, beating each of them by five shots!. Later that year Alvie partnered with Knudson representing Canada in the World Cup, hosted by Argentina. 1962 was also the


year Alvie achieved Class A status with the PGA of Canada.

If 1962 was Alvie's breakout year, then 1963 confirmed he was the real deal. Alvie won the Millar Match Play, (Canadian PGA Match Play Championship) finishing as low qualifier and then beating Al Balding in the semi-final and Peter Hildrop in the final. That year he was invited to play in the Masters where he tied for 28th place, shooting 71 in the final round.

In 1964, Alvie won his second Manitoba Open and finished runner-up to George Knudson in the Canadian PGA Championship in Halifax. The following year, 1965, Alvie assumed the Head Professional's role at Whitevale Golf Club in Toronto and later that year he finished second to Wilf Homeniuk in the PGA Championship, held that year in Montreal.

In 1967, Alvie moved over to the Bayview CC in Toronto as the Playing and Teaching Professional. He played a number of events on the old Caribbean Tour. In the Venezuela Open in Caracas he shot 64 in the first round of the 72 hole event and went on to lose a playoff for the title. That same year he ventured off to qualify for the US Tour (it was not called the PGA Tour until later) where he finished 10th out of a field of 112, finishing ahead of players like Tony Jacklin, Orville Moody, Bob Murphy, Dean Beman and Lee Elder.

In 1968, Alvie won the Manitoba Open (again!) as well as the Fredericton Open and finished

second in the BC Open and the Ontario Open. He had the Best Stroke Average on the Canadian Tour and as a result was invited to represent Canada in the Alcan Golfer of the Year event held at Royal Birkdale GC in England. The following year Alvie finished 10th in the Doral Open in Florida.

In 1970, Alvie's focus shifted to the Club Professional world as he was appointed Head Professional at the Hillsdale GC in Montreal (site of this year's Canadian Women's Open). He remained there through 1972 when he moved back home to Vancouver to became the Head Professional at Marine Drive GC. He had gone 'full circle'. Alvie stayed at Marine Drive for four years before switching over to McCleery GC in 1976 where he was the Head Professional for 18 years.

Alvie earned Life Membership status with the PGA of Canada in 2000 and come 2013, Alvie will become a 50 year member of the PGA of Canada.

Alvie commented to me on

how fortunate he was that he was able to be around Stan Leonard so much during his formative years. Alvie learned a great deal from Stan. That is the defininition of mentoring, and Alvie passed on his vast knowledge of the game and the business of golf to Professionals such as our Association President, Derek Thornley, Jim Pringle (Head Professional at Sunshine Coast GC), Pat Dunn (Head Professional at McCleery GC), Mike Smedstad (GM at Mayfair Lakes GC), Norm Jackson (Head Professional / GM at Cowichan GC) to name only a few.

All had the opportunity over the years to work for, and learn from, one of Canada's finest players and professionals and are now

mentoring those younger professionals under their employ.

Alvie and his wife Donna are now retired and living the good life on the Sunshine Coast. Alvie still plays the occasional game of golf, and they do manage to get some time in the warmth down south each winter. ~ Barrie McWha

Following win at the 1962 CPGA Championship, Alvie was sponsored by the House of Seagram to play in the Mexican Open. Alvie was leading the tournament tied with Tony Lema and Jackson Bradley when he hit 3 balls out of bounds off the 1st tee, scored a 10, then followed up with 8 birdies for a 3rd place finish.

Invited to play in the 1962 Masters at Augusta National in Georgia.

Tied for 28th after shooting 71 in the final round.

Alvie played The Caribbean Tour to keep his game sharp in the winter. In order to play, Alvie qualified for the McNaughton Bursary, a field of about 50 players fighting for 3 spots. One highlight was in the Caracus Venezuala Open where Alvie shot a first round 64, tied for 1st but lost in a playoff.

Won the Millar Trophy (emblematic of the CPGA Match Play). Alvie beat Al Balding in the semi-finals and Peter Hildrop in the final. Alvie was 26-under par for the 110 holes played.

CBC Televison matches at Jasper Park. Alvie beat Moe Norman and George Knudson. He lost to Stan Leonard in the final.

Invited to play in the Carling Cup Matches in Toledo, Ohio - Canada vs USA 4-ball matches - 8 players - Amateurs vs Professionals - USA won

### GOLF-A-THON FOR ALS RISES TO NEW HEIGHTS

#### Standerwick hikes The Golden Hinde

rett Standerwick, Apprentice Professional at Fairwinds Golf Club, has participated in the PGA of BC Golf-a-thon for ALS presented by uniPharm & Medicine Centre Pharmacies Charitable Foundation for the past four years. This year, Brett decided to raise the stakes of his Golfa-Thon by golfing as he attempted to summit the Golden Hinde, the tallest peak on Vancouver Island at 2,196 meters (7,207 feet).

On September 16th, Brett began his trek up the Golden Hinde. He started off at the base of Mount Golden Hinde supported by his father, Ken, and friend, Derek Kilbourn. Brett had packed his 8 iron, a small hitting mat and four dozen biodegradable golf balls made of compressed wood for the journey.

Brett and his two man team spent three days summiting this impressive peak. Brett played golf shots off his mat as they hiked up, but in areas where it was impossible to get a shot off, he bounced his golf ball on the blade of his 8-iron as he hiked along. By the end, Brett felt that he had taken well over a 1,000 shots!

Brett continued golfing to within 680 meters of the top where they were forced to stop as it became too dangerous to continue due to the weather.

During the three day expedition the three men experienced white outs of sleet and 100 km strong winds with the poorest ALS weather experienced during the niaht.



"The wind was so loud on the second night it sounded like a train coming through our tent," Brett commented. "The sound was amazing!"

After participating in the annual PGA of BC Golf-A-Thon for ALS over the past few years, Brett was looking for a way to generate more buzz and exposure for this important fundraising event.
